Aloha!

The Statehood Rally in Honolulu on August 21, the 50th Anniversary of the fake "State of Hawaii", and other island wide actions were exciting and important events in promoting good public education and justice around the issue of the U.S. occupation of the independent state of the Kingdom of Hawai`i, established by King Kamehameha I in 1810.

As you probably know, the U.S. empire was wrongfully developed through, amongst many other things, the invasion of Hawai`i in 1893 when Queen Lili'uokalani was ousted in terror. As the empire crumbles, as the truth about statehood bubbles up and the "government on Beretania Street" is a source of public ridicule the Hawaiian independence movement is hastening the demise of this military monstrosity in the region.

AntiStatehood Hui (ASH) attracted resources and help in supporting the rally at the Hawai`i Convention Center. Our make-up is more often than not the cruel brunt of

oppression in an imperial occupation. We support the killstatehood campaign which attacks, nonviolently, the fraudulent notion of statehood.

We are students, houseless, veterans, working poor, environmentalists, disadvantaged and concerned community members. The anti-statehood rally was a pivotal success. As Lynette Cruz anticipated the truth was outside with the festive rally while the fake state cowed inside the Convention Center. Lynette was a rally leader with organisers, Hawai'i Independence Action Alliance. The rally represents a new game where the state is playing defense.

To my knowledge the AntiStatehood Hui is the only group in the movement that does not have a Kanaka Maoli racial bias because, like myself, many of us are non-Kanaka Maoli and are affected by the local hardship and humiliation that comes with occupation.

We understand the acclaimed multi-ethnic make-up of the Kingdom of Hawai'i at the time of the overthrow. We see the royal council of non-Kanaka Maoli like John Young, an Englishman, who was a senior advisor to King Kamehameha I and Royal Governor of Hawai'i.

Throughout the monarchy non-Kanaka Maoli worked to initiate and maintain an internationally recognised Hawaiian nation, one most capable of adopting foreign systems, for example Greek democracy and Westminster-style government, for Hawaiian protection and advancement. This is the essence of standing used by the movement today. We see a diversity of loyal and valuable officials at work in all but the highest position of Hawaiian Government. We see the voluntary royal adoption of architecture, burial ways, cultural practices and state symbols from diverse parts of the world, for example the use of the Union Jack owned by the British Empire being set into the Hawaiian flag because of the interest of King Kamehameha I.

We are also stakeholders in this Pacific region seeking a just, nonviolent, nuclear free and sustainable world and so we seek to bring the USA to international account for these reasons.

Under the shameful historic circumstances of colonial-type takeover, we are pleased to support the many governments, individuals and entities that form the united Hawaiian independence movement.

We support and thank HIAA and the other sponsors of the successful Statehood Rally action.

Finally, bravo to our immediate supporters, participants and our well wishes across the planet.
